Used in herbal medicine since the 1st century, Horehound is an expectorant and tonic that can be safely used by adults and children often made into a tea, syrup or candy in order to disguise its very bitter taste.

• Therapeutic*: used for lung and breathing problems including cough, whooping cough, asthma, tuberculosis, bronchitis, and swollen breathing passages. Also helpful to digestion, diabetes, appetite, indigestion, bloating and gas, liver and gallbladder complaints.

- Its root, used equally with Plantago lanceolata, is a remedy for rattlesnake bites.
- Works to thin mucus secretions, reduce spasms in the stomach and intestines, and decrease inflammation.
